The EDB's 23rd Presidential Export Awards Ceremony Recognizes Top Exporters

The Presidential Exports Award Ceremony organized by the Sri Lanka Export Development Board (EDB) annually to recognize those who have contributed to the export sector, was held for the 23rd time this year on Thursday, September 19 at the Bandaranaike Memorial International Conference Hall (BMICH) under the patronage of President Maithripala Sirisena.

This year's ceremony recognized the exporters for their excellence in the financial year 2018/19 and the awards symbolize the national recognition of exporters, particularly in non-traditional products and service sectors.

At the ceremony held with the participation of a large number of exporters, a total of 89 awards - 14 Overall Awards for the year 2018/2019, 42 Sectoral Awards for services and products and 13 Merit Awards for talented individuals were presented.



The award winners were presented a prestigious PEA Trophy and a Certificate & they have the privilege to use the "Award Logo" as a marketing tool for a 3 year period.

The selections for the awards were done by an eminent Panel headed by the Retired Judge of the Supreme Court.

The Presidential Export Awards (PEA) initiated by the EDB in 1981, is the most prestigious award for exports in Sri Lanka and is presented to the exporters who have made a significant contribution to Sri Lanka's exports.

Winners were evaluated based on their performance during the financial year 2018/19 in terms of Export turnover, number of employment opportunities created, Market diversification, Growth rate as well as Value addition. Merit Awards presented to the next best exporters based on their performance as decided by the PEA Panel of Judges under Sectoral Awards.

MAS Holdings (Pvt.) Limited won overall award for the "Exporting Conglomerate of the Year" and celebrate export excellence by a Sri Lankan Conglomerate at the Presidential Export Awards 2019 and Brandix Apparel Limited won this year's "Exporter of the Year" overall award



Sri Lanka Spices

Spices have been traded globally since the ancient times given their importance in seasoning food and serving as medicine. Spice production is dominated by few countries.


Spices are used to add flavor, colour, aroma to food for the preservation of food and beverages. Spices may be derived from many parts of the plant: bark, buds, flowers, fruits, leaves, rhizomes, roots, seeds, stigmas and styles or the entire plan – tops. Spices are often dried and used in processed but complete state. The following are classified as spices pepper, pimento, vanilla, cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg, mace, cardamoms, anise, fennel and ginger.

The Sri Lanka, spice sector is dominated by small farm holders with over 70% of the cultivated lands representing small holdings and home gardens. Sri Lanka exports around 30 thousand tons of various kinds of spices annually. However, the spice sector has a significant potential to expand its current reach and contribute to Sri Lanka's social economic development by the creation of jobs and increasing the export revenue of Sri Lanka, as is it the largest producer and exporter of "true cinnamon" in the world.

According to the Central Bank, spices earned \$ 330. 3 million in the first 11 months of 2018, but it recorded a 11.6% drop during this year when compared to the same period of the preceding year.

However, the market is expected to change due to the stringent government regulations related to food in countries such as Canada, the United Kingdom, France, Italy and the United States of America. Several food safety organizations, such as the United States Food and Drug Administration, have set high standards regarding the safety of spices intended for use by consumers.





Consumers in the EU, the United States and Canada are paying more attention to aroma, health, flavor, hygienic packing and product innovation rather than price. The availability of a wide variety of ready-to-use spice mixes will soon be a key driver in the global spice market. Organic spices are another fast expanding segment, especially in the European, the Middle Eastern and Asia pacific markets, Recently, there has been a growing consumer preference for certified organic and fair trade spices.

The country's spice sector is facing many challengers and producers are finding it difficult to sustain their businesses in the long run. They are courageously engaged in the sector while facing strong competition globally. Major challenges faced by the industry are declining global commodity prices, international tariff and non-tariff barriers, competition, the increasing cost of production, lower productivity, and the lack of value addition and innovative products.


Innovation is necessary at all levels of our industry, including growers, processors, brokers, and exporters. Innovation is also necessary to minimize the cost of production. Marketers will be able to find new buyers and capture new markets.

As a country, Sri Lanka should consciously work towards moving away from the vagaries of commodity marketing and produce value added branded products with our spices.

EDB Successfully Conducts 20th Exporters' Forum



Sri Lanka Export Development Board (EDB) successfully conducted the 20th Exporters' Forum on 3 September, at the EDB Auditorium under the patronage of Deputy Minister of Development Strategies and International Trade Nalin Bandara.

The forum took up 17 issues for discussion relating to operational and policy-level matters in connection with cross-border trade. Most of the of the exporters' issues presented at the forum revolved around matters pertaining to customs duties, corporate tax, CESS, and the SVAT system.

At the forum, Nalin Bandara requested the officials of various government departments to pay swift attention to the issues forwarded by exporters in order to provide speedy solutions. The Deputy Minister at the event praised the untiring efforts of the EDB in facilitating exporters and bringing their problems to the attention of policy makers.

The forum was attended by representatives from a cross section of private sector companies, while the officials of the BOI, Industrial Technological Institute (ITI), The Department of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources, Sri Lanka Customs, IRD, CEB, and Geological Survey and Mines Bureau took part from the public sector.

EDB Chairperson and Chief Executive Officer Indira Malwatte and EDB Director General Jeevani Siriwardena graced also graced the occasion.

EDB's Exporters' Forum is held once every two months and provides a common platform to discuss and resolve the issues faced by the exporter community in Sri Lanka in order to facilitate exporters to overcome constraints arising from policy and operational issues created by various institutes that regulate, operate, and facilitate cross-border trade.
