Sri Lanka's IT/BPM Industry

Sri Lanka's IT/BPM sector took less than 15 years to become the country's fifth largest exporter. In 2013, export revenue grew to an estimated US\$ 720 million, total employment increased to 33,700 and companies in the industry now stand at over 220. ATKearney has ranked Sri Lanka among the Top 25 in its Global Services Location Index and the National Outsourcing Association, UK named Sri Lanka its Offshoring Destination of the Year in 2013-2014, just two of the many recognitions the country has received.

Yet, it is what to come that is more impressive, with the industry now aiming to rake in revenues of US\$ 5 billion by 2022. Along with this will be 200,000 direct job opportunities with each job creating three more indirectly, and over 1,000 start-ups.



Inclusive Growth

To bring about widespread development in Sri Lanka, there needs to be inclusive growth that encompasses regional systems. 80% of the nation's current workforce comes from regional areas and this is where our greatest untapped human resources lie as well. Given that the IT/BPM industry can operate from any location, if an enabling business environment and sound infrastructure are in place, the IT/BPM industry is in a position to spearhead inclusive growth and this is precisely what the Kandy IT Week is all about – promoting regional development by creating a firm foundation to build up our country's future on.

Why Kandy?

In Sri Lanka, Kandy is one of the cities that has been identified as it has the potential to be developed as a second tier city given the infrastructure already in place, connectivity, and current and planned development.

Through the existing network of schools, the University of Peradeniya and other private sector higher education institutes, Kandy also holds the capacity to generate skilled workforces, which is a pressing requirement for the IT/BPM industry. Companies such as IFS have already set up operations in Kandy and have proved that the city indeed holds the potential for far more growth.

'Future Careers' is a career awareness programme which will target 1,500 school children in the Central Province and will be conducted by SLASSCOM. A highly successful programme which has been carried out in various parts of the country over the years, the fair aims to educate shool children about IT/BPM industry both globally and locally, and open their eyes to the wide range of possibilities and job opportunities available within the sector.

This will encourage students to pursue IT degrees once they leave school and further deepen the talent pool available to the industry in years to come. The fair consists of two main sessions – the first, a general introduction to the IT/BPM industry, what Sri Lanka's position is in the world market, the education path needed to be followed to get into the industry, employment opportunities etc. This will be delivered in the form of a seminar to a large group of school children.

This will be followed by a one-to-one counselling sessions, where students are divided into groups of around 10 and are assigned to a counsellor (who is generally from a private sector company), who will give them more in-depth information and clarify the the students' issues.





Several of these two - stage sessions can be carried out within the course of a day and students from many schools will be able to benefit from this highly useful and educational initiative.

Why you should attend

The program will provide you with an up to date insight into the global and local IT industry, outlining the opportunities available in this rapidly growing industry which has had a growth rate of 20% over the last few years in Sri Lanka. It will also feature invaluable knowledge sharing sessions with industry experts from SLASSCOM's member companies which will give you the chance to have one-to-one sessions with them to clarify all your queries about the industry as well as help you build useful contacts with some notable personalities in the country's IT sector.







Agenda

45-minute seminar

This seminar will target 400-500 students and will provide a general introduction to the IT/BPM industry, showcase the spectrum of available employment opportunities, benefits of following a path in IT.

Career counseling session

The seminar will be followed by career counselling sessions, where students are divided into groups of around 5 to 10 and are assigned to a counsellor (who is generally from a private sector company).

Future Careers Innovation Competition

Objective of this competition is to provide a platform for students who have all ready designed innovative technology enabled systems, to showcase their inventions to industry experts and obtain feedback to improve. The students will also be able to exhibit their projects for fellow students, attending the career awareness programme.
