



AN ANALYSIS OF THE KENYAN ECONOMY AS A STRATEGICALLY IMPORTANT EXPORT MARKET FOR SRI LANKA (2008 – 2012)

(Inclusive of January – October 2013 Export Data)

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November 2013

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

It has been brought in to focus that our export markets are not sufficiently diversified to minimize the dependency on a few large exports markets; where at present EU and USA together absorb more than 50% of the country's total exports. A major objective of the EDB is to increase exports to markets other than EU and USA by over 50% by 2015, while consolidating the market position in the EU and USA. Therefore this study was carried out to fulfill the main objective of exploring opportunities in the Kenyan market for Sri Lanka's exports.

The **key findings** of this research work are summarized below.

- It should be highlighted that the Kenyan economy is expected to grow at a rate of 6% in 2014. The main reason for that is due to the high investment related to the discovery of oil and gas in 2012.
- Kenya is ranked as the 12th easiest economy for doing business among Sub- Saharan African countries.
- Our exports to Kenya have recovered well in 2010 after the world financial crisis which was prevailing during 2009. From 2009 to 2011, our exports have been increased by US \$6 million which is a 51% increase in export revenue.
- Since Kenya is a strategically important location to reach other East and West African markets, we should work closely with relevant agencies such as Sri Lanka High Commission in Kenya to solve the prevailing issues related to exporters and liaise with Ministry of External affairs and Department of Commerce to examine the possibility of Preferential Trade Agreements with Kenya.
- The trade balance turned in Sri Lanka's favour registering a trade surplus of US \$ 5 million in year 2012
- Sri Lanka caters for a small share in the Kenyan market. Sri Lanka's share in the Kenyan market has been increased after 2008 and thereafter Sri Lanka managed to increase that share in the Kenyan market.
- Sri Lanka is the largerst supplier of Garments nes, of other textile materials, knitted (611490), Yarn (551120) and Natural rubber in other forms nes (HS.400129) to the Kenyan market. Furthermore, Sri Lanka is among the top 10 exporters for many selected products in the Kenyan market.
- 20 major products currently exported to Kenya have greater opportunity to expand and further, 9 products have been identified as potential exportable products which are not being currently exported to Kenya by Sri Lanka. However Sri Lanka's exports of these potential products other countries and are in high demand in Kenya as well.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

Kenya is the largest economy in the East Africa and it is in a major Strategic position between West Africa and East Africa. Kenya is a strategically important location to reach other East and West African markets for Sri Lanka. Kenya is more diversified than other economies in the region. The economy of Kenya shows a continuous growth as shown below. It should be highlighted that the economy is expected to grow at a rate of 6% in 2014. The main reason for that is the high investment related to the discovery of oil and gas in 2012. Other strengths of the Kenyan economy are the availability of better telecommunications systems and the developed financial service in the country.

3.0 EASE OF DOING BUSINESSES IN KENYA




5.0 SRI LANKA'S SHARE IN KENYAN MARKET

6.0 BILATERAL TRADE BETWEEN SRI LANKA AND KENYA



However during that period, Sri Lanka managed to reduce the trade deficit with Kenya from US \$ 6 million to US \$ 3 million. During 2012, the trade balance turned in Sri Lanka's favour registering a trade surplus of US \$ 5 million which is illustrated in the following table.

9.0 BARRIERS TO TRADE

Kenya is a member of the East African Community (EAC) with a population of about 80 million. It is also a member of the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) with a population of about 380 million. Exports and imports within member countries benefit from preferential tariff rates. EAC Member States have signed a Protocol to establish a Customs Union.

12. CONCLUSION

This analysis focuses on the Kenyan economy as a Strategic export destination for Sri Lanka. After analyzing the Kenyan market, it has been identified that 20 products which are being currently exported to Kenya by Sri Lanka are capable of generating higher revenue to Sri Lanka. The import market for theses selected items are growing at a considerable rate in Kenya. Even though there is a high demand for these products in Kenya, Sri Lanka has not been able to exploit the full potential due to supply side constraints and also due to trade barriers such as high tariffs as well. Products currently exported to Kenya with greater opportunities to expand and potential exportable products to the Kenyan market which are not currently exported by Sri Lanka have also been identified.

Sri Lanka is among the top ten exporting countries for most of the products identified in this analysis. We should conduct awareness programmes about the Opportunities available in Kenyan Market to Sri Lankan Exporters and to launch Promotional Campaigns in Kenya.

Since Kenya is strategically important location to reach other East and West African markets, we should work closely with relevant agencies such as Sri Lanka High Commission in Kenya to solve the prevailing issues related to exporters and liaise with Ministry of External affairs and Department of Commerce to examine the possibility of Preferential Trade Agreements with Kenya.

- Knitted or crocheted fabrics (HS.600410)
- Mens/boys trousers and shorts, of synthetic fibres, not knitted (HS.620343)

- Titanium pigments and preps, <80% titanium oxide (HS.320619)

It is also suggested that the potential Sri Lankan exporters be identified and be informed about the opportunities in the Kenyan market and also give them possible support to enhance their trade with Kenya.
