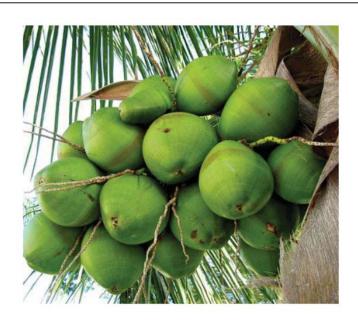

#### 1. Introduction

The coconut industry is an important source of foreign exchange earning & employment generation for Sri Lanka.

A total of 1,095,982 Acres are under coconut cultivation of which 178,675 Acres are under estate sector and 917,307 Acres are under small holdings. An area of 34,063 Acres are used for cultivation of king coconut. Annual nut production is estimated at 2,623.10 Mn nuts in year 2018. Approximately two third of the coconut production in Sri Lanka is consumed locally and the balance one third is used for coconut based industries and exported to various destinations as value added products.

Sri Lanka has earned foreign exchange earnings worth of US\$ 588 Million by exporting coconut and coconut based products in 2018. Sri Lanka has a comparative advantage in this sector due to its legacy & geographical location, skilled labour, modern and indigenous technologies for processing. Sri Lanka is ranked as the 1st largest exporter of coir and coir related products and 3<sup>rd</sup> largest exporter of desiccated coconut and coconut oil according to the world rankings in year 2017. x Coco peat and Fibre pith, Twisted Fibre, Bristle Fibre, Mattress Fibre, Moulded coir products (pots, coco disks, grow bags, briquettes, grow cubes, open tops, seedling

plugs etc.), Coconut Husk Chips, Coir Yarn, Geotextiles, Coir Twine, Coir Mats And Rugs, Rubberized Coir Pads, Brooms and Brushes, Tawashi Brushers etc.

#### **Coconut Shell Products:**

x Activated Carbon, Coconut Shell Charcoal, Coconut Shell Pieces, Coconut Shell Powder.

## 4. Geographical distribution

West and North Western provinces are mainly the coconut intensive areas – otherwise known as the "Coconut Triangle". Three main districts in coconut production are Kurunegala, Puttlam and Gampaha. Other than coconut triangle there are coconut mini triangles located in the areas covering; a.) from down south Kalutara to Tangalle and b.) Northern Province - Jaffna, Mannar and Mulative district.

# 6. Government policy and support available in the sector

The Coconut Development Authority is a premier government institution involved in the development of this sector in Sri Lanka. They run capacity building and hand holding programs for farmers as well as processors in the areas of Farming practices, new product development and market linkages. They also operate an auction system for coconut enabling the farmers get a better return on their produce.

The Export Development Board (EDB) is the apex state organization responsible for the development and promotion of Sri Lankan exports. The EDB takes a leading role in the development and export promotion of the Sri Lankan coconut industry by implementing various programmes. International trade fair participation, facilitate B2B promotions and organizing inward and outward buyer/seller missions, assistance for exporters own marketing efforts and promoting company brands in overseas by Market Development Assistant Scheme (MDA). EDB is also extending assistance to resolve constrains and issues faced by the Sri Lankan exporters.

A couple of institutions in Sri Lanka are involved in developing and transferring technology for coconut fibre & kernel based value added products processing & manufacturing. The key institutions working in this sector are:

- x Increase in coconut cultivation to increase raw material supply base is now feasible in War & Tsunami affected areas
- x Introduction of high yielding varieties and reduce height of trees for easy harvesting
- x Shift towards natural and organic products in global markets
- x Increase demand for coconut water as energy drink based on hydrating properties
- x Available infrastructure across the country roads, railways, ports

- x Opportunity to establish new industries in areas where the raw material not utilized such as Northern & Eastern provinces
- x Reduce raw material export and focus on value added products
