An Update of

Tariff Concessions for Sri Lanka under Pakistan – Sri Lanka Free Trade Agreement as at 13.06.2014

As a result of the persistent negotiations conducted between Pakistan and Sri Lanka including the discussions at the 11th Session of the Pakistan – Sri Lanka Joint Economic Cooperation held in Colombo November 2013, chaired by the Commerce Secretary of the two countries, the Government of Pakistan has granted preferential market access, with immediate effect for the following Sri Lankan products under the Pakistan – Sri Lanka Free Trade Agreement (PSFTA).

- 1. The 35% Margin of Preference (MOP) currently available for betel leaves has been increased to 50% MOP. (Effective MOP is 57%)
- 2. 100% MOP for the Electrical Switches under H.S. 8536.5010
- 3. 100% tariff concession for fermented beverages (Ginger juice) under H.S. 2206.0000
- 4. Restored 20% MOP on the following ceramic products under H.S. Chapter 69
