CHALLENGES FOR SRI LANKA'S EXPORTS WITH BREXIT

On 31st January 2020, the UK left the European Union following an unprecedented Brexit vote. On 19 May the UK Government announced its new tariff regime - the United Kingdom Global Tariff (UKGT) scheme or the Most Favoured Nation tariff regime of the UK, designed specifically to suit the UK economy. It is the first independent tariff policy in almost fifty years. UKGT will replace the EU's Common External Tariff (CET) and will be effective from 01 January 2021 ie, after the Brexit transition period.

The UKGT regime has differences compared to the current EU CET and it is important to understand the competitive position of Sri Lankan exports in the UK market after 2021 in the light of the proposed preferential scheme that will be introduced.

The purpose of this webinar is to educate the Sri Lankan exporters on the upcoming UKGT reg ime and explain the post Brexit market challenges and opportunities
